

If you wish to participate in the 2016 OKNASP State Shoot, you must first submit a team score from an Inter-school Shoot. **Inter-school Shoot scores must be received by January 11, 2016.**

There are two options for Inter-school Shoots:

Option 1:

One or more schools travel to another school campus to participate in a shoot.

Option 2:

If a school cannot travel, the coach from another OKNASP school can come observe your students at your facility and those scores will be accepted.

A standard NASP shoot is composed of a practice End at 10m and 3 scored Ends at 10m, followed by a practice End at 15m and 3 scored Ends at 15m. Record the scores for each team member. Remember there is no limit to team size at Inter-school Shoots. Identify the top 12 scores of your team (including at least 4 of each gender). Submit these scores to ODWC using the Inter-school On-line Submission Form here: <https://wildlifedepartment.wufoo.com/forms/2016-oknasp-prequalifier/>.

There is no minimum score to qualify. All teams submitting scores will be allowed to participate in one of the shoots listed below.

Remember, there will be no Regional Shoots.

To allow full participation, there will be (4) State Shoot events, each team will be assigned to one of them:

DATE	EVENT	LOCATION
February 10, 2016	West State Shoot Tier 2	OK State Fair Park, Cox Bldg.
February 11, 2016	West State Shoot Tier 1	OK State Fair Park, Cox Bldg.
February 24, 2016	East State Shoot Tier 2	Tulsa Expo Square, River Spirit Expo
February 25, 2016	East State Shoot Tier 1	Tulsa Expo Square, River Spirit Expo

Tier assignments will be determined from the submitted Inter-school Shoot scores. Scores will first be categorized as East or West. Then, they will be subdivided at the midpoint, or closest point to the midpoint, into upper and lower halves. The upper half will be assigned the appropriate Tier 1 event and the lower half will be assigned the appropriate Tier 2 event. There is no way of knowing what the midpoint will be or which shoot your team will qualify for until we have received all scores. If all goes well, we will post who qualified in what Tier by January 18th.

Remember:

- There is no limit to team size at Inter-school Shoots, however no more than 12 scores, including 4 from each gender, should be submitted.
- There is no limit to how many Inter-school Shoot events a team may participate in.
- Only one set of scores per team should be submitted. Scores submitted must be from a single event (you cannot combine events to improve your team score).
- Schools having less than 16 participating students will still qualify.
- You must provide contact information (name, phone and email) for yourself and the other participating school coach/administrator from the Inter-school Shoot.
- Be sure to keep a copy of all scores generated at your event.
- The maximum team size for the State Shoot will be 16 students (Team score is comprised of top 12, including 4 of each gender).
