Any resident of Oklahoma who reaches 63 years of age shall be eligible for the senior citizen lifetime license during the calendar year in which said person turns 64 years of age. Any resident of Oklahoma born before January 1, 1923 is exempt from purchasing a hunting and/or fishing license and receives the benefits of the senior citizen lifetime license.

SENIOR CITIZEN COMBINATION HUNTING/FISHING LICENSE, \$10.00

As the owner of a lifetime combination license, you may hunt and fish in the State of Oklahoma for as long as you live, subject to the rules set forth for the separate hunting and fishing licenses described below.

SENIOR CITIZEN HUNTING LICENSE, \$6.00

Senior citizens age 63 or 64 are exempt from the purchase of one deer gun license; one controlled hunt deer gun permit (if applied and drawn), either antlered or antlerless; Blue River Passport; and the Land Access permit (if age 64 or older).

Senior citizens age 65 or older are exempt from the purchase of two deer gun licenses (one antlered and one antlerless), the special antlerless deer gun license, one controlled hunt deer gun permit (if applied and drawn), fur license, Oklahoma waterfowl stamp, Blue River Passport, and Land Access permit.

All other permits, fees, and licenses must still be purchased, including a **bear license**, a trapping license, turkey licenses, deer archery licenses, deer primitive licenses, a third deer gun license, and controlled hunt fees.

SENIOR CITIZEN FISHING LICENSE, \$6.00

As the owner of a senior citizen fishing license, you may fish in the waters of this state, as set forth in the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation fishing regulations, for as long as you live. The senior citizen fishing license does not exempt you from having to purchase a **trout permit** if you fish in designated trout streams during trout season, or a **paddlefish permit** when fishing for paddlefish.

REQUIREMENTS TO QUALIFY:

Only persons who are residents of Oklahoma and have been so for at least 60 days immediately prior to the date of purchase may obtain a senior citizen license. Documentation proving residency must be presented for approval.

A lifetime license holder, whether it be combination, hunting, or fishing, will not lose the benefits of the license by a change of address, even if he or she ceases to be an Oklahoma resident by moving out of the state. If you move, you should report your new address to our office.

APPROVAL: If ordered by mail, the applicant must contact a Game Warden or a store authorized to sell hunting and fishing licenses for approval of the application **before** submitting it to our office.

REPLACEMENT: If the lifetime license is lost or destroyed, a duplicate license will be issued for a fee of \$5.00. Contact the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation for a replacement application.

All senior citizen licenses are **non-transferable**, and must be obtained from the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation, P.O. Box 53465, Oklahoma City, OK 73152.
