# SALT PLAINS LOOP

As you explore the salt flat habitat along the Salt Plains Loop, be on the hunt for these loop features.

## SCAVENGER HUNT



**One (1) White Bird.** Look along the edges of ponds, marshes and lakes for Great Egrets, Snowy Egrets and American White Pelicans.



**Two (2) Wildlife Conservation License Plates.** With eight designs to choose from, motorists are personalizing their vehicles with wildlife themed license plates.



**Three (3) Types of Bird Houses.** Be on the lookout for Purple Martin houses, wooden Eastern Bluebird boxes along fence rows, or large Wood Duck boxes in the marshes.



**Four (4) Types of Trees.** Cottonwood and Blackjack Oak are just a few options. Be sure to press the fallen leaves you collect. *(Please do not remove plant material from the Salt Plains National Wildlife Refuge.)*



**Five (5) Mammals.** Watch for White-tailed Deer, Raccoons and other mammals on your travels.



**Six (6) Butterflies.** Keep an eye out for white, yellow, orange and black butterflies on your nature walk. Do you know what our state butterfly is?



**Seven (7) Signs of Nature.** Look for animal tracks, scat or feathers along the nature trails.



**Eight (8) Plants Animals Eat.** Try to figure out what the animals of the Salt Plains eat.



**Nine (9) Selenite Crystals.** Dig for our state crystal on the Salt Plains National Wildlife Refuge from April 1 to October 15.



**Ten (10) Wildlife Silhouettes.** Take the nature trail at Byron Hatchery Watchable Wildlife Area and look for the wildlife silhouettes in their natural habitat.
