Introduction

A trout creel was conducted at Route 66 Park Pond (10 acres) and Edwards Park Pond (5 acres) in Oklahoma City. The ponds are located on the east and west sides of Oklahoma City. December 2021 was the first year of the trout stocking at these locations. Previously, trout were stocked at Dolese Youth Park Pond. Rainbow Trout are stocked approximately every other week from Dec-Feb. Below are the preliminary findings for an in-person trout creel for Dec. 2021-March 2022. The creel is still being conducted for 2023-2024.







Max – 45miles, Average 11.13miles


Q13: Number of trout caught and released for entire party:

Fifteen of the parties interview caught and released fish. Thirty four fish were released.


Q14: Total number of trout in possession for entire party:

Thirty-three parties had fish in possession when interviewed. They had a collective of 56 fish.






Q17: Fishing satisfaction (1 to 10) 1 being poor and 10 being excellent:








Q22: Angler comment and/or repeat visit:

Others mentioned that they enjoyed trout fishing and are happy to have an opportunity to trout fish in OKC. Some asked for more trout to be stocked and larger trout. A few asked about a trout stamp, so we could increase the possession limit.

Edwards Park Pond Findings



The average party size was 1.3. The max group size was 6. Eighty interviewed fished alone and 65 fished with more than one person.


Q9: Number of adults fishing:

129 adults were fishing


Q10: Number of children fishing (<16):

Q15: What are you fishing for?:


Everyone, except four, fished for trout. The others fished for Crappie, Channel Catfish, sunfish, and Largemouth Bass.


Twenty-five parties released fish. Thirty-eight fish were released.


Thirty-two parties had fish in possession. Sixty-one fish were in possession. The most a party had was 6. Most interviewees with fish, only had one.










While talking with anglers, fishing satisfaction was typically dependent on whether they had caught fish or not when interviewed or the weather of the day.




